






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






WHAT'S THE SILENT MAJORITIES' OPINION ON WIND ENERGY

85% agree with wind turbines (WEA) in their residential environment (Ø 78%)

86 % think: The use and expansion of onshore wind energy are (very) important (ø 82 %)

73 % would have no or no major concerns if wind turbines were built in their residential environment (Ø 70 %)

provide sufficient land for wind energy to achieve the climate targets (Ø 72 %)

74 % say: The public sector should







THE SITUATION IN GERMANY



political acceptance is declining

- path dependencies
- party-political considerations
- personal perceptions/assessments of policy makers
- ...

perception of the community acceptance

- ⇒ dominated by resistance
- ⇒ lack of positive dynamics



CONCLUSIONS

- local acceptance is changing within the project development
- passive acceptance is not enough
- key is: active support for wind-projects and trust
 - good reasons for the local communities (e.g. value creation)
 - positive messages and information
 - participation and involvement
 - positive stories
 - questioning routines and stetting rules (e.g. land securing)
 - linking policies for wind energy and regional development
